Dear Parents and Carers

Following a review of our Belonging and Behaviour Policy by the governors, we have re-launched it with the children this week. The policy is attached to this Bulletin, but the following gives a very brief summary:



#### Growing together as Children of God

Consequences now take place on the day, or as soon as possible afterwards. Consequences may include missing playtime, missing lunchtime and completing a reflection sheet with the headteacher, to talk through the behaviour, and discuss what could happen next time. Forgiveness and apologising are at the heart of our policy – children are encouraged to repair any relationships that may have been broken as a result of behaviour. Golden Time is now used as a whole class reward.



It was wonderful to see so many of our pupils in their Rainbow, Beaver, Brownie, Cub, Guide or Scout uniforms to celebrate World Thinking Day and Founder's Day.

Year 4 enjoyed creating hip-hop tracks as part of their music technology unit this week using YuStudio.



Some of our second-hand uniform has been sent to Kibera - these pupils are so happy to be wearing it!



Y4 had a lovely French lesson where the children made their own monsters to describe in French (face / body / colour / size descriptions - which they will write up next lesson). They really enjoyed doing it and came up with some fantastic creations.



Year 5 had a wonderful (but rainy!) day at Moonwalkers. The children loved it and were excited to learn that the next crewed mission to the Moon will be in 2026!



In assembly this week, the children found out about a new competition they can enter to design some artwork inspired by the Fourth Plinth in Trafalgar Square. They can create something in 2D or 3D, ideally inspired by modern art, London, the fourth plinth, or any current issue. They can do this on a template which is available at school, or without it.

There are 2 age categories: 5–7 and 8-11. The closing date is Friday 8th March.

There will be winners and runners up in each age group, as well as winners from every borough in London.
