
The children are learning so much in their French lessons – here are some of our KS2 pupils practising word order and playing games to consolidate phrases.

Smart Watches

We have seen a growing number of children wearing Smart watches to school. Ideally, we would like these to stay at home, but if your child wears one in school, then they must be switched to classroom mode for the entire time they are at school. If your child attends a club or After School Club, the classroom mode must be extended until these clubs have finished. If they are not in classroom mode, then school staff will look after the watches until the child goes home. Thank you for your co-operation.

If you log your child's late arrival on the Parentmail absence feature, then you may also use this to order your child's lunch.

We have had a number of occasions when children have arrived mid-morning, expecting to have a school lunch, which creates difficultuies for the kitchen team.

If you do not order a lunch, then please provide your child with a packed lunch.
