In French this week Year 3 enjoyed the interactive linguascope games - one child at the front moved the speech bubbles and the rest of the class supported and encouraged!








Protecting our children's health - MMR (Measles Mumps and Rubella) vaccination

I'm sure you'll be aware of the recent measles outbreak in Birmingham and the West Midlands which has been widely reported in the news (216 confirmed measles cases and 103 probable cases since 1 October last year). This situation is escalating, and Public Health are seeing 60-70 cases of measles per week. The attached letter from Public Health was sent to me and provides details of how we can share information about immunisation clinics in a variety of home languages.
