We have had another busy week in school – the following photographs give a flavour of what some of the children have been up to. This week in worship we have been celebrating Christian Aid week, and giving thanks to God for his creation, but also thinking about ways that we can help protect the world that God has made. Next week is Walk to School Week – if you usually drive to school, how about seeing if you could walk instead.



Year 6 have been using collage to create abstract London Eye art and using Google Sites to create their own web pages about a passion of theirs.



In PSHE, Year 2 have been learning about Conflict Resolution. They used dominoes to show how sometimes an argument can start with I or 2 people but a lot of people can get involved. They used a stop hand to remind themselves that they can change the outcome but also to remember to stop and calm down when in an argument. They could see how less dominoes/people were affected when they did this.











Year 5 made Multiplication and Division board games to consolidate their learning – they had great fun playing them. They have also been learning about micro-organisms in Science and conducted an experiment to find out which food yeast likes best.







Year 3 have been busy creating their own craft puppets as part of their Art and Design Curriculum.



Year I have been making their own safari animals out of different materials for their 'We're going on safari' topic.

Children in Year 4- Year 6 are free to choose their own song. Own choice songs MUST be age appropriate (i.e. no inappropriate lyrics or content). They may sing on their own or with a friend, but it is up to them to sort out who to sing with and to rehearse together.

It is a great opportunity for those that learn an instrument to have the chance to perform to their friends. A good standard of performance is expected.
