## Arrangements for September 2021

As you will have read in the news, from 19<sup>th</sup> July 2021, the majority of COVID restrictions have been lifted. Despite the restrictions being lifted, from September 2021, we have decided to keep some of the measures that were in place this year that have worked so successfully.

	The one-way system will not operate at the end of the school day. Please enter/exit via either the Faraday Gate or Effra Gate.		
Can my child bring their bike or scooter to school?	We encourage all families to walk/scoot or ride to school. Bikes and scooters can be stored in the shelter in the playground.		
What happens if one of the children in my child's class has COVID.	The guidance currently states that from 16 <sup>th</sup> August 2021 children under the age of 18 will no longer be required to self-isolate if contacted by NHS Track and Trace as a close contact of a positive COVID case. Instead, they will be contacted by NHS Track and Trace and advised to take a PCR test. Schools will no longer have the role of identifying close contacts, NHS Track and Trace will do this instead. It is hoped that this will prevent whole classes having to self-isolate.		
Will the children have play time?	Years I, 2, 3 will have playtime at 10.15-10.30 Years 4, 5, 6 will have playtime at 10.30-10.45		
How will lunchtimes be organised?	Lunchtimes will continue to be staggered. Children will be seated in their classes for lunch and will play in an allocated Play Zone with their year group. Year groups will rotate around the Play Zones during the week. Within each Play Zone there are different activities including:

	Children will be supervised by the same staff members each day, and will include staff from their year group teams, as well as specific lunchtime supervisors.		
	An indoor Lunch Club will be available each day for invited children, who are able to invite a friend.		
What other measures will the school put in place to continue to prevent the risk of infection?	<ul> <li>We will continue with the following measures:</li> <li>Minimising contact with individuals who are unwell by ensuring that those who have coronavirus symptoms, or who have someone in their household who does, do not attend school</li> </ul>		
	<ul> <li>Ensuring good respiratory hygiene by promoting the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach</li> </ul>		
	<ul> <li>Engaging with the NHS Test and Trace process</li> <li>Enhanced cleaning regime – including cleaning throughout the day of</li> </ul>		
	<ul> <li>frequently touched surfaces</li> <li>Year groups will continue to have allocated toilets which will be cleaned regularly</li> </ul>

Will visitors be allowed into school?	Essential visitors will be allowed in school.		
Will worship (assemblies) take place?	The guidance states that whole school worship can now take place.		
Will the school office be open?	The school office will be open for essential business only. At the beginning of term we will arrange for a 'mobile' office to be located in the playground.

Will there be school trips?	The government continues to advise against overseas residential visits, but this is being reviewed in September.		
	All other trips and visits can take place as normal, with the usual thorough risk assessment being conducted prior to the trip.		

Will school uniform be worn? What about PE 'uniform'?	Yes – children should be in full school uniform. The new PE uniform will be expected to be worn on PE days for the whole day. This has worked so well this year. Children will be informed of their PE days on the first day back		
	at school.		
What will my child be taught?	We aim to teach an ambitious and broad curriculum from the outset. Long Term plans for each Year group will be posted on the Learning Platform and website.		
	Interventions for specific children will start straight away in September as part of our Recovery (Operation Boost) program. Some families have already been informed of summer holiday tuition and groups.		
What will my child need to bring?	We would be grateful if your child could bring the following items in their school bag:

	• 2 Fluorescent highlighter pens – <b>KS2 only</b>		
	<ul> <li>Whiteboard Pen (ideally Show-me Fine/ Slim Drywipe Whiteboard Pen)</li> <li>I 5cm ruler</li> </ul>		
	<ul> <li>30cm ruler</li> <li>Small pair of scissors</li> <li>Eraser</li> </ul>
