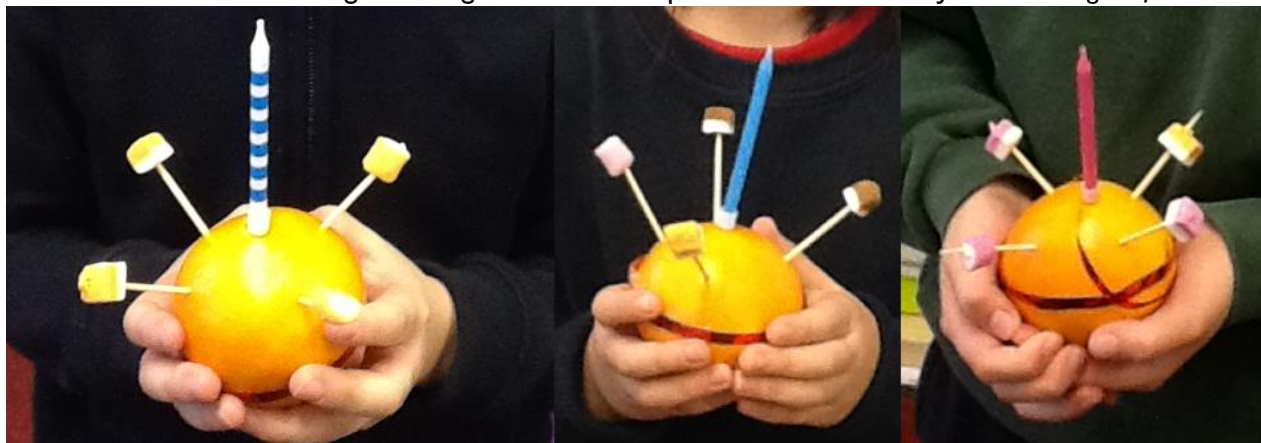




Year 1 wrote letters to Santa, and went to the post box to post them.

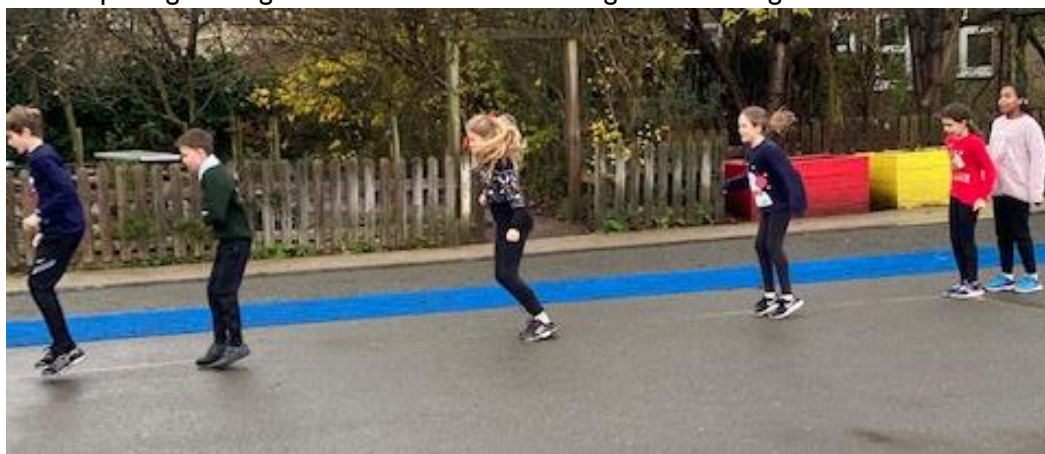


Year 2 had a lot of fun making Christingles this week as part of our RE unit on *Jesus is the Light of the World!*

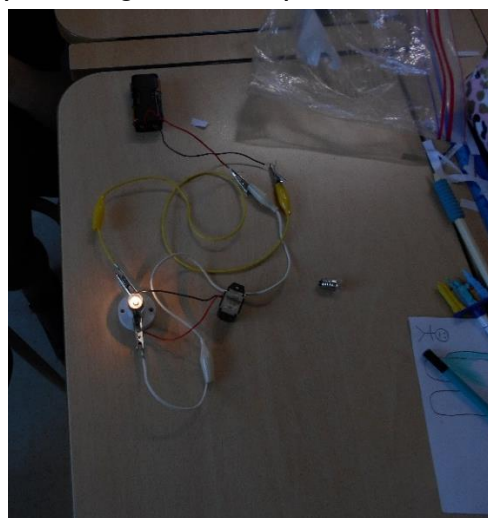

### End of Term Arrangements

You may have heard in the news that the Government/DfE have said that schools might want to consider having Friday 18<sup>th</sup> December as an INSET day (and make the day up another time). The reason for their suggestion is that school leaders are being asked to be 'on call/available' for 6 days after the last day of term, in case a pupil or staff member tests positive for COVID and others have to be contacted to self-isolate. The DfE did not want school leaders to have to be available on Christmas Eve, hence the suggestion of the INSET day on the 18<sup>th</sup> Dec!
