Year 4 enjoyed a trip to the Bank of England Museum on Tuesday to support their geography topic, 'Earning a Living'. They learned a lot about the Bank of England, bank notes and gold bars (of which there are about 400,000 in the Bank's vault, each worth just over £1,000,000!) The children even had a go at lifting a real gold bar (in a secure cage!) and discovered it is incredibly heavy!



We are delighted to share that Constance won her second European title this Sunday, November 9th, in Dublin. She completes her 2025 year as a double European Champion in both Brazilian Jiu-Jitsu versions (Gi and No-Gi). She is also ranked 6th in the world and is the only non-Brazilian athlete in the top ten.


Children in the choir will be participating in both services.






