There is a word which can help with this. Can you work out what it is?


How about: SHARE?


This is one way in which we can celebrate the harvest – by sharing what we have (which may be more than we need) with our neighbours and those in real need.

COVID Update

If there is a positive COVID case in your child's class, I will send a Parentmail to the whole class to let them know. Due to changes in the self-isolation rules, only the child (or adult) who has tested positive would need to self-isolate for 10 days. Schools no longer have the responsibility of identifying close contacts as NHS Test and Trace fulfil this role. If your child is in the class of a positive case, even if you are not contacted by NHS Test and Trace, you are advised to get a PCR test for them as a precautionary measure. If you are getting a PCR test as a precautionary measure, the current guidance is that there is no need for your child to self-isolate until the results are in.

If we have a positive COVID case in school, this is reported to the Merton Public Health Team.

If your child has any COVID symptoms, please keep them off school, and arrange for them to have a PCR test. Please keep school informed.

To keep us all safe, families are strongly advised to take regular Lateral Flow Tests to pick up any asymptomatic cases. For further information about COVID and testing click on the link https://www.merton.gov.uk/coronavirus/test

Video Parent Teacher Consultations: Monday 18th to Friday 22nd October

Parents and Carers are invited to attend two separate Parent Teacher Consultation appointments each year – one in the autumn and one in the spring. Written school reports are provided each summer term.

This term's Parent Teacher Consultations will be via video, using the Google Meet tool and will be held over a 5-day period, between Monday 18th and Friday 22nd October. The consultations for different classes will be held on different days and at different times.

We know that many of you like to look at your children's books so we hope that in addition to your Consultation you will also join us for a 'Share My Learning' event before school on 10th and 11th November. More information will be provided nearer the time.

The Parent Teacher Consultation meetings offer an opportunity for you to meet with the class teacher to discuss your child's progress this term and any questions you may have. The teachers will not have any assessment data to share with you (this will be sent out separately later in the term) and the emphasis of the conversation will be on how your child has settled in to their new class and the key areas of focus over the coming weeks. These meetings are for parents and carers only – children should not attend.

We are once again combining our Parent Teacher Consultations and SEND Support Form Meetings. Our standard Parent Teacher Consultation appointments will last for 10 minutes and the parents of children with SEND Support Forms in place will be given a 20-minute appointment instead, to allow time for discussion of your child's targets for this term.

As in previous years, we will be using the ParentMail system to organise the parent teacher consultation appointments. All bookings must be made between 7am on Monday 4th October and 7pm on Friday 8th October. If you miss this booking window you may not be able to have an appointment as part of this programme. To make a booking, please log into your ParentMail account (on a computer or via the app). Please look for the 'Parents Evenings' option in the left-hand panel. If you have any problems please contact the team in the school office.

The Google Meet links and instructions will be sent out by ParentMail on or before Friday 15th October.

A few reminders

After School - Please may I remind you that children should not play on any of the school equipment (trim trail, climbing wall etc) after school. We have had a number of accidents in the past after school, and we wish to avoid these. Thank you.

Photographs/Videos - Please remember not to take photographs or videos on our school premises. We have a number of children who cannot have their photograph taken for various reasons, and we wish to keep all of our children safe. Thank you.

The Primary Years is a time of rapid development and huge change; it is also a time where emotions can be expressed and experiences in many different ways.

These key skills involve being able to identify how we are feeling, understand why we are feeling a certain way, and find ways to bring us back to a place where we feel more in control. Emotion Regulation is a core skill that helps us with our relationships; ability to concentrate; and self-esteem. The

session aims to discuss: -What is Emotion Regulation and why is it important -Present a way of talking about emotion regulation for home and school (the zones of regulation -Discuss how parents can help support Emotion Regulation skills? -Introduce an Emotion Regulation Toolbox -Discuss Frequently Asked Questions and Next Steps (Resources and Ideas)
