### News from the Growing Together in Spirit Team

The Growing Together In Spirit team are delighted to announce that they have selected two charities that they would like us to support during Advent.

The Lunchbowl Network is a charity that we supported last year and we are delighted that Carolyn Green will be speaking to us during our Monday Collective Worship. Carolyn has recently returned from a visit to the Kibera where she was able to go into the schools and to meet up with the children who are looked after and supported by the charity. Our donations last year made a huge difference to those children and we would like to raise some more funds for them this Christmas.

The team feel very strongly that we should support a charity closer to home as well. We have picked the Wimbledon Foodbank who last year saw 200 families per day in the week before Christmas. They are a valuable and much needed source of support for local families but even more so at this time of year. The staff have

advised that they do not have very much space to store food items and have asked for a monetary/gift card contribution. We will collect your cash donations and then buy gift cards for local supermarkets. These will then be given to families so that they can buy a Christmas Dinner and have funds for food over the festive period.

The Growing Together in Spirit Team will be selling small gifts (made in the Kibera) and also collecting donations to the Foodbank each day over the next two weeks. Please put your donation for the foodbank into an envelope marked Wimbledon Foodbank. The items for sale are priced at £2 for a keyring and £4 for a soapstone plate. # School Admissions Arrangements - draft policy for consultation 18 November 2019 to 12 January 2020

As a Voluntary-Aided Church of England school, Holy Trinity school in Wimbledon is the admissions authority responsible for setting admissions arrangements annually for both the nursery and school places. Every seven years, in accordance with the Schools Admissions Code 2014, we must consult on these arrangements.

This year we have made some suggested minor amendments to the policy in line with other schools within Merton or Southwark Diocese which are highlighted in yellow in the draft policy so it is easier for you to determine the changes from our current Admissions Policy published on our website (dated March 2019 for admissions from September 2020). Namely amends relate to:

- Children of staff children of permanent staff will be on our priority list (to help with staff recruitment and • retention)
- Siblings (Open places priority will be given to siblings who applied as an open place) ٠
- Tiebreaker (in instances where two or more applicants have equal priority for final places) ٠
- Nursery places (clarifying full and part time places available) •
- Waiting lists (Year 2 and above will operate as one list)

### The proposed draft policy (which can be found on our website

https://www.holytrinity.merton.sch.uk/web/admissions/308143 ) will take effect for entry into nursery and reception from 2021 and be ratified at a full Governing Body meeting after the consultation period ends on 12 January. The new policy will be published on our website by 15 March 2020.
