These are handed in to class on arrival and returned at the end of the day.

The guidance challenged me about my use of my smartphone! Let's have a whole community Smartphone challenge, and try not to use our phones in the playground when dropping or collecting the children! This would be a great way of modelling the behaviour we want from our children.


