COVID Update

If there is a positive COVID case in your child's class, I will send a Parentmail to the whole class to let them know. Due to changes in the self-isolation rules, only the child (or adult) who has tested positive would need to self-isolate for 10 days. Schools no longer have the responsibility of identifying close contacts as NHS Test and Trace fulfil this role. If your child is in the class of a positive case, even if you are not contacted by NHS Test and Trace, you are advised to get a PCR test for them as a precautionary measure. If you are getting a PCR test as a precautionary measure, the current guidance is that there is no need for your child to self-isolate until the results are in. If we have a positive COVID case in school, this is reported to the Merton Public Health Team.

If your child has any COVID symptoms, please keep them off school, and arrange for them to have a PCR test. Please keep school informed.

To keep us all safe, families are strongly advised to take regular Lateral Flow Tests to pick up any asymptomatic cases. For further information about COVID and testing click on the link https://www.merton.gov.uk/coronavirus/test

Merton Winter Homeless Night Shelter 2022

Volunteer groups are exploring the possibility of setting up a communal nightshelter which would run throughout January and February 2022 and be held at The Salvation Army hall on Kingston Road. It is proposed that various volunteer groups that have previously run the shelter at their own premises, will each take responsibility for one regular evening/morning per week and Holy Trinity Church will work with St Winefride's to cover the Thursday evening to Friday morning slot. A maximum of eight guests could be safely accommodated at the venue. Shelter shifts would be along the lines of the old system, i.e. 3 shifts, evening (5.30pm-10pm), overnight (10pm-6am), morning (6am-9am). The Salvation Army hall has a fully equipped kitchen, where an evening meal can either be delivered or cooked on site. The hall also has shower and laundry facilities.

Covid measures such as guest and volunteer testing, social distancing, screened sleeping areas, ventilation units, protective clothing etc would all be put in place. A risk assessment will be undertaken by Housing Justice and all health and safety measures will be signed off by Merton Public Health, the Salvation Army and the YMCA. The YMCA will provide a project co-ordinator to undertake guest assessment for entry into the shelter.
