Share My Learning

Share My Learning sessions will be held on Wednesday 10th November (for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) and Thursday 11th November (for Years 3/4/5/6) from 8.15-8.45am. Children will be able to take their parents/carers up to their classroom and share what they have been learning.

If you are arriving between 8.15am-8.30am, please enter via the main front door on Effra Road. After this time, enter via the Faraday Gate from the playground. When you have finished seeing your child's work, please send your child out to their line in the playground. We will ask parents to vacate the building at 8.45am so that we can start the school day promptly.

We are trying to limit the number of adults in the building at any one time, so please only come on the set days.

School Closed on Friday 26th November

As you are aware, the Government has allowed schools to choose a day to close this academic year in lieu of the extra Bank Holiday for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee in 2022 (which falls in the May half term).

We have chosen to close on Friday 26th November 2021, but other schools may have chosen a different day.

Flu Immunisation Catch Up Session (Reception to Year 6) - Tuesday 16th November

COVID Update

If there is a positive COVID case in your child's class, I will send a Parentmail to the whole class to let them know. Due to changes in the self-isolation rules, only the child (or adult) who has tested positive would need to self-isolate for 10 days. Schools no longer have the responsibility of identifying close contacts as NHS Test and Trace fulfil this role. If your child is in the class of a positive case, even if you are not contacted by NHS Test and Trace, you are advised to get a PCR test for them as a precautionary measure. If you are getting a PCR test as a precautionary measure, the current guidance is that there is no need for your child to self-isolate until the results are in. If we have a positive COVID case in school, this is reported to the Merton Public Health Team.

If your child has any COVID symptoms, please keep them off school, and arrange for them to have a PCR test. Please keep school informed.

To keep us all safe, families are strongly advised to take regular Lateral Flow Tests to pick up any asymptomatic cases. For further information about COVID and testing click on the link https://www.merton.gov.uk/coronavirus/test
