Dear Parents and Carers




This week saw the grand opening of our new stage. We are so grateful to Savills Estate Agents and HOTS for their generous sponsorship of our stage.















Year 5 attended a virtual Tessellation workshop this week, as part of London Maths Week. They then enjoyed making their own tessellations.

## **COVID Update and Reminders**

As you will have seen from the news, the number of COVID cases is on the increase again, especially in school-aged children. Whilst the guidance is still to get your child tested if they have a temperature of 37.8°C or above, a persistent cough, or a lack of taste or smell, the Delta variant seems to come with other symptoms too. Merton Public Health have advised us to inform you that if you or your child has a headache, sore throat, fatigue, or even vomiting/diarrhoea, then these may also now be COVID symptoms, and should be tested via a PCR test.

If anyone in your household is awaiting test results, then all members of the household should self-isolate until the results are through. If the PCR test result is negative, then of course children may return to school.

Up to a quarter of Merton schools have had to close bubbles – let's be extra vigilant in these last few weeks. Thank you so much for your support.
