### The Learning Platform

This is a reminder that there is a wealth of information about your child's curriculum, and how you can support them with their learning at home on the class pages of the Learning Platform. Your child will have their own log in for this. The teachers update it each week with information about what your child has/will be learning. Any Home Learning is also posted here.

When your child is off sick, teachers will not set work for them to complete, but the Learning Platform would be a good place for you to look if your child is feeling well enough.

#### Share My Learning

Share My Learning sessions are an opportunity for children to show their parents/carers their work and their classroom.

Share My Learning sessions will be held on the following days:

- Tuesday 7th February, 8.15-8.45am for EYFS and KS1 (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2)
- Wednesday 8th February 2022, 8.15-8.45am for KS2 (Years 3-6)

If you arrive between 8.15 and 8.30am, please enter via the main front door on Effra Road. After this time, enter via the Faraday Gate from the playground. We will ask parents to vacate the building at 8.45am so that we can start the school day promptly.

We will be reviewing the days that we hold Share My Learning sessions, to consider whether we can vary them. Do watch this space.
