I hope you enjoyed your half term. It has been wonderful to see the children back in school, excited about their learning. This week we had visits from our Merton Education Partner (who also happens to be an Ofsted Inspector!) and the Merton School Sport Partnership (MSSP). Our MEP was looking at maths throughout the school, and she was so impressed by how articulate our children are at explaining their maths learning. MSSP were equally impressed by the sports teaching at Holy Trinity. Both visits were very encouraging, and affirming.



Nursery have had a very first week back. We have stated our new topic, 'Growing.' We explored the life cycle of the frogs. This week we also celebrated Pancake day or Shrove Tuesday. We discussed why it was important to Christians and shared what we might want to give up. Miss Ade loves buying books, she will be pausing her purchasing for Lent!



On 22nd February we marked World Thinking Day and Founder's Day. Children were invited to wear their uniforms to school. It was wonderful to see how many of our children are involved in these uniformed organisations.



Ryan, his mum Charmaine and I (Ms McHenry) went to Buckingham Palace last week for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee Art Competition prize winners' event. (winner's entries can be found here: <u>https://platinumjubilee.lgfl.net/the-platinum-jubilee/gallery-of-artwork</u>).

It was initially in The Queen's Gallery which is part of Buckingham Palace and houses art from the Royal Collection. We had a couple of speeches from staff from the Royal Collection as well as LGfL, and the 12 winners were presented with their framed artwork with stamps confirming their art had been on display in Buckingham Palace! After an opportunity to look around their current exhibition, which displays Japanese art and crafts from the last 300 years which has been gifted to the Royal family, we were given an exclusive guided tour of the State Rooms at Buckingham Palace! We were guided up the grand staircase, through the various drawing rooms where the Royal family meet important guests, the throne room, the ballroom, the music room, and along cavernous corridors housing magnificent pieces of art by famous artists such as Rubens, Vermeer, Canaletto, Van Dyck and Titian. We were shown secret, hidden doors and admired stunning frescos and huge chandeliers and were dwarfed by the high ceilings, some reaching up to 58 feet! No one else was in the State Rooms as it doesn't open to the public until August, so we felt truly honoured to have been given such access.



This was all down to Ryan's amazing talent and artwork that he created for the competition, and a reminder that entering these competitions really is worth it, so read on to find out more about our next competition.

In assembly this week, the children found out about a new competition they can enter to design some artwork inspired by the Fourth Plinth in Trafalgar Square. They can create something in 2D or 3D, ideally inspired by modern art, London, the fourth plinth, or any current issue. They can do this on a template which is available at school, or without it.

There are 2 age categories: 5–7 and 8-11. The closing date is Friday 10th March.

There will be winners and runners up in each age group, as well as winners from every borough in London.

Winners will attend a presentation ceremony in City Hall, and all winning entries will be in an exhibition later this year. For any questions, contact Miss McHenry.

I would like to say that our teachers are not taking the action lightly. They are, quite rightly, standing up for schools to be appropriately funded in relation to teachers' pay rises. Currently, any increments have to be provided from the school budget, and whilst teachers' salaries are decided at government level, a rise for teachers without the appropriate government funding for school to pay for them means that a cut has to be decided from elsewhere, ultimately taking money from the children in other areas. This is something that we as school leaders find very difficult. What should be lost? Resources? Educational visitors? Curriculum enrichment? A member of support staff? The teachers at Holy Trinity and across the country are passionate about their jobs and care deeply about providing the very best for your children, therefore those striking are doing so to highlight the unfairness of the lack of funding for all our children. In addition to providing the highly skilled services that they do, many have the added stress of a below inflation increase meaning that in real terms, many teachers are challenged with the cost of living and being able to make ends meet for themselves and their families.
