If you have any old keyboards, cameras, phones, tablets or other devices that you no longer need, we would be so grateful for them to be used in our role play areas. The items do not need to work! Do drop any items off with Mrs Rickards at the gate. Thank you.

Mobile Phones

May I remind you that children should not be bringing smartphones into school. Only children who walk to and from school on their own may bring a phone in, and this should be a basic model. We have heard of recent reports of children (not from our school yet) having their smartphones stolen as they have used them on their way to school, or on their way home. Basic phones are far less attractive to muggers. Argos have basic pay as you go phones to buy from $\pounds 2.50$!

From 8th June 2021 (after half term), any smartphones seen in school will be handed to Mrs Rickards. Parents/carers will be contacted to come and collect the phone from school. This policy is very similar to many of the local secondary schools.
