May we know that You are the God of hope who fills us with joy and peace as we trust in You.


May the Holy Spírít whisper reminders in our ears to take time to be with You to remember that You have got it all covered.

School Closed on Friday 26th November

As you are aware, the Government has allowed schools to choose a day to close this academic year in lieu of the extra Bank Holiday for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee in 2022 (which falls in the May half term).

We have chosen to close on **Friday 26th November 2021**, but other schools may have chosen a different day.

Christmas Lunches

This year our school Christmas lunches will be held on Tuesday 7th December (Reception, Year I and Year 2) and Wednesday 8th December (Years 3-6). Children should bring a packed lunch on the day when they are not having their Christmas lunch.

The menu will be as follows:

Roast turkey served with a chicken chipolata sausage, sage stuffing balls, roast potatoes, peas, carrots, gravy and cranberry bread (halal version available) or

Special Christmas Wellington (vegetarian) with sage stuffing balls, roast potatoes, peas, carrots, gravy and cranberry bread

The dessert options available on the day will include Christmas chocolate log. Special Diets will be catered for.

Children in Reception, Year 1, Year 2 and those eligible for Free School Meals will receive a free meal in the normal way. All other children will be charged $\pounds 2.23$ and this will be payable through ParentMail in the normal way.

Our catering company Caterlink have asked for final food orders by the end of next week, so we would be grateful if you would **complete the ParentMail form sent this week by Thursday 25th November**. If your child is absent on the day of the Christmas lunch you will not be charged.

COVID Update

If there is a positive COVID case in your child's class, I will send a Parentmail to the whole class to let them know. Due to changes in the self-isolation rules, only the child (or adult) who has tested positive would need to self-isolate for 10 days. Schools no longer have the responsibility of identifying close contacts as NHS Test and Trace fulfil this role. If your child is in the class of a positive case, even if you are not contacted by NHS Test and Trace, you are advised to get a PCR test for them as a precautionary measure. If you are getting a PCR test as a precautionary measure, the current guidance is that there is no need for your child to self-isolate until the results are in. If we have a positive COVID case in school, this is reported to the Merton Public Health Team.

If your child has any COVID symptoms, please keep them off school, and arrange for them to have a PCR test. Please keep school informed.

To keep us all safe, families are strongly advised to take regular Lateral Flow Tests to pick up any asymptomatic cases. For further information about COVID and testing click on the link https://www.merton.gov.uk/coronavirus/test
