that equalities and race is woven through the curriculum establishing natural links throughout subjects as well as providing discussion time in class developing to secure knowledge in racial literacy.

Another very successful sport event – athletics this time. Well done to the team who won gold, silver and bronze medals, and the all-important Refspect award. We are so proud of you all.




Year 5 had two training sessions this week, where they learnt how to do lawn bowls. Some of the children will then go on to represent our school in a tournament next week.


