#### **Medication**

If your child has an inhaler, epipen or any other regular medication please don't forget to visit the office to drop the medication off.

#### **School Meals Price Increase**

The price of the school meals has gone up to £2.12 per meal for children in years 3-6. There is no charge for meals for children in Reception, Year I and 2.

# **Car Parking**

I have already received an email from one of our neighbours informing me that a parent has parked across his drive, preventing him from getting to an important meeting. Please be considerate of our neighbours and do not park across their drives.

### **KS2 Pencil Cases**

As you may be aware, we ask that all Key Stage 2 children bring in their own pencil cases for use in class. Please see below a list of items that are required:

- Simple pencil case (please do not send expensive pencil cases or those with 'gadgets' as these can be a distraction in the classroom)
- 2 x black handwriting pens (e.g. Berol Handwriter or Frixion 0.7mm Rollerball NOT a biro)
- Simple HB pencil
- Fluorescent highlighter pen
- 15cm Ruler
- Eraser
- Pencil sharpener
- Glue stick (not coloured)
- Colouring pencils (not smelly or glitter pencils)

# **Optional Stationery Items**

• Felt tip pens (named if practically possible)

Please ensure that the pencil case is named and, if possible, all of the equipment. Please check and re-stock the pencil case during the holidays or as often as needed.

We do have a small supply of stationery in each classroom so if you are unable to provide these things from home please let the class teacher know in September.

# **Mobile Phones in School**

In keeping with a number of local secondary schools we have decided that from September onwards, **smart phones should not be brought into school by children under any circumstances**. If children need mobile phones to contact their parents when walking to and from school, we suggest that you purchase a simple pay-as-you-go 'brick' phone (ideally with no camera) for this purpose.

On arrival at school, phones should be handed in to the class teacher and they will be returned at the end of the school day. Mobile phones may not be used by children anywhere on the school premises, therefore they may not be used in the school playground, in Breakfast Club, in After School Club or in one of the Activity Clubs which are organised through the school.

If your child needs to contact you, or you need to contact your child, at any time when they are in the school building, the office staff will be happy to help.

### **Attendance**

We shall be monitoring the attendance of our pupils very closely. Please remember that holidays/time off should not be booked during term time. Any absence will only be authorised in exceptional circumstances.

### Trim Trail

For safety reasons all children (pupils and their younger siblings) should not use the trim trail before or after school.

#### Scooters and Bikes

As soon as children reach the school gate they should push their bike or scooter to the bike/scooter park, to ensure that the playground is a safe place for everyone.

#### Snacks

The Government provides a piece of fruit or vegetable for all children in Reception, Year I and Year 2. Children in Years 3-6 are welcome (and encouraged) to bring either a piece of fruit or vegetable in to eat at break time. No other snacks should be brought to school.

## **Allergies**

We have an increasing number of children with severe nut allergies. Please ensure that your child doesn't bring any nuts into school in any form. This includes Nutella, peanut butter and cereal bars.

Please also remind your child that they should not share any of their lunch with anyone else, as we have children with other severe allergies.
