Dear Parents and Carers

New DfE Guidance

We have now received further guidance from the Department for Education following the new national lockdown restrictions. The full document can be found here <u>https://www.gov.uk/guidance/education-and-childcare-settings-new-national-restrictions-from-5-november-2020</u>

The document can be summarised as follows:

- Schools remain open, and should continue with the protective measures that are already in place
- All children, provided they are well, should attend school as usual
- Wraparound care (Breakfast Club and After School Club) may continue, as it provides childcare to support working parents
- Children who were originally classed as clinically extremely vulnerable should contact their health professionals to see if they continue to be in this category if they do, then they should not attend school during the lockdown period (please email <u>headteacher@holytrinity.merton.sch.uk</u> if this applies to you)
- Children who live with someone who is clinically extremely vulnerable should still attend school
- Sport/Physical activity can still take place preferably outdoors, or in a well-ventilated space
- Music lessons (including those conducted by peripatetic teachers) can still take place, provided they do so in a well-ventilated space
- Face coverings do not need to be worn in primary schools (the guidance actually states that children aged 11 upwards should wear masks in communal settings, but I have sought advice on this, and 11 year olds in primary schools do not need to wear masks) I am happy for children to wear masks/face coverings in school, as long as they use them properly

Remote Learning

If your child has to self-isolate because they have been in contact with a positive case of coronavirus, then they will be issued work on the learning platform.

If a whole bubble has to self-isolate, then the work will also be set on the learning platform, but this will include some virtual face-to-face contact with the teacher (providing the teacher is well) each day. The learning platform will indicate which work needs to be completed each day, and how children should upload the work so that they can receive feedback.

Warm Clothes

It can be cold in school! Please consider allowing your child to wear an extra layer of clothing under their school shirt/polo shirt. School fleeces can also be worn indoors.

Parent Governor Nominations

The term of office for one of our parent governors is coming to an end. They are eligible to stand again and we would welcome nominations from other parents too.
