ParentMail Problems

A few parents have told us that they are having problems with their ParentMail apps. We think this might be following an update from ParentMail.

If you are having problems accessing your app please try:

- Switching off your phone completely and then switching it on again
- Deleting and then reinstalling the app from the App Store or Google Play (this has worked for some families)

Music Festival

This term sees the return of our Music Festival for Year 2 - Year 6. This is an opportunity for children to prepare a performance and sing to the class, or, if they learn an instrument, to play to the class. The heats will take place in music lessons in the weeks beginning 6th and 13th May, with some children being selected to perform in the Finals on Wednesday 22nd May.

Children in Year 2 and Year 3 may choose to sing one of the songs that we are learning in class or their own choice of song. Children in Year 4 - Year 6 are free to choose their own song. Own choice songs MUST be age appropriate (i.e. no inappropriate lyrics or content). They may sing on their own or with a friend, but it is up to them to sort out who to sing with and to rehearse together.

It is a great opportunity for those that learn an instrument to have the chance to perform to their friends. A good standard of performance is expected.
