#### **Nut-free School**

We have had a recent focus on allergy awareness at school, and I thought it would be a good opportunity to remind you that we are a nut-free school. No items containing nuts (including Nutella, cereal bars, peanut butter etc.) must be brought into school in order to protect our children who have serious allergies.

The children have been reminded that they mustn't share food, but if you could speak to your child about this too, we would be very grateful.

### **No Smartphones**

We have noticed that some of our older children are bringing smart phones into school. As you are aware, the only type of phone allowed in school is a 'brick' type phone. The only children who are allowed to bring a phones in to school are those who walk to and from school unaccompanied.

#### **Wet Weather Collection**

As it often seems to rain just as school ends I thought it wise to remind you that our wet weather collection routine is the same as the dry weather collection. Children are dismissed from their doors for Nursery, Reception and Year I. All other children are brought to the playground and dismissed as usual. Please do not wait outside the back door as this causes a bottleneck. Thank you so much for your help with this.

Due to a clash of bookings, we have had to change the date of the Maths Workshop, due to be held next week. It will now be held on Thursday 30<sup>th</sup> April, from 7.00pm.

#### **Lozenges/Cough Sweets**
