Sport Update

Many of you gave us feedback about the provision of sport at Holy Trinity. We have listened and have now employed a coach who works across Years 2-6 on a Tuesday or Thursday.

Please read the following to find out about some of the changes we are making in relation to our involvement in competitions:

How do I know which competitions we	Please see the attached list which gives further information about the events on
are entering?	offer this year
How will children be picked for the teams?	Children will now be picked for teams during their PE lessons by their teachers and the coach.
Will we be sending more than one team to competitions like some other schools?	This depends on the type of event. There are some events (usually called festivals) which are more inclusive and less competitive – we are usually only allowed to send one team to these events. Other events involve a competitive element. For these events we will endeavour to send 2 teams. One team will be made up of those who performed best in the PE lessons, and the other will be made up of those who tried really hard. For both teams, children must display good sportsmanship, and show respect.
My child plays sport outside of school – will this be taken into account when selecting teams?	Children will not be selected just because they play the sport competitively outside school – they will still need to show their ability in lessons.
How will I know if my child has been selected for a team?	You will receive a letter via Parentmail 2 weeks before a competition.
How will the teams be trained for the events?	In the run up to a competition our coach will be organising some training sessions at lunchtime for the team/s.
Who will be accompanying the teams to the events?	A member of school/coaching staff will accompany all teams together with parent helpers.
How can I help?	Have a look at the dates of the events and email <u>headteacher@holytrinity.merton.sch.uk</u> with the dates of any events you can help with. We would really value the help of parents even if your child isn't selected to be in the team!

Might your child be eligible for Pupil Premium?

If you haven't already done so, can we encourage you to complete the short form

at <u>https://self.merton.gov.uk/service/Pupil_Premium_and_Free_School_Meals_application</u> (or complete the coloured paper application form available from the school office) to see whether the school can claim Pupil Premium funding for your child? **All you have to do is provide your contact details and National Insurance number and Merton Council will do the rest.**

If your child is entitled to Pupil Premium funding the school will receive additional money each year. In the past this has been used to fund interventions, books, school trips, residential trips and activity clubs. Children in Key Stage 2 who are entitled will also receive hot meals free of charge (Children in Reception and Key Stage I already receive free meals).

This applies to children from nursery through to Year 6.
