Dear Parents and Carers

Thank you so much for all of your support this week. We have spoken to our Year 5 and 6 children this morning, reassuring them that we live in a safe community and that what happened yesterday is very rare, but that there are measures we can take to keep us even safer when we are walking to and from school unaccompanied.

Some of the measures we spoke about included:

- Walking with purpose and not dawdling
- Meeting up with friends to walk together
- Keeping to the busier roads
- Walking behind other HT families, who are on their way to school
- If they have a phone, keeping it in a pocket or bag so that it is out of sight
- If they are concerned about someone near to them, walk into a shop or cafe and speak to the adults there
- If someone calls their name, to assess the surroundings and then turn around to see who it was, rather than immediately turning around



Understanding masculinity

The context of masculinity in the 21st century

We'll explore the wider social context shaping boys' beliefs and behaviours—including the influence of social media, online influencers, “the [Manosphere](#)”, and pathways to online radicalisation. We'll also discuss the challenges many boys and young men face, from mental health struggles to peer pressure and gender expectations.

- Modelling empathy, care and emotional openness
