We are starting the new year with a whole school project, 'Growing Our Future'. Children in Early Years will be reading 'Errol's Garden'; KSI are reading 'The Secret Sky Garden'; and KS2 are reading 'The Promise. All three texts focus on a child's desire to impact on the natural world around them through rewilding, and on building a sense of community through interacting with nature in shared spaces. During the project we will build the children's knowledge of the importance of plants, trees and flowers to people and wildlife in the local community and engage children in positive acts of change to support rewilding in their local area.

Classes have already been enjoying the out of doors and visiting South Park Gardens.





Year 5 explored plant reproduction and propagated a spider plants using its spiderettes. We will see whose grows the best!

You will need to be someone who is passionate about all aspects of childcare and education, and able to bring new ideas to the role. You will need to have a caring and dynamic approach, as well as an ability to lead and motivate a range of staff. Full support will be provided by our Senior Leadership Team as we work together to establish this new role.

We are also looking to appoint one or more proactive and enthusiastic After School Club Assistants to work from 3pm to 6pm on Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays, with the possibility of additional work to cover occasional staff absence on the other days of the week. You must be warm and responsive, able to work flexibly as part of a team to provide a high-quality stimulating environment for the children in our care.


