Priority I	Increase the number of children accessing the Third Space Learning programme for maths tuition.
Priority 2	Set up 1:1 and group tuition sessions delivered after school with current teachers
Priority 3	Intervention Teacher delivering 1:1 sessions for pupils with dyslexia and those working towards in Writing.
Priority 4	Implementing new, highly recommended intervention resources such as Dynamo Maths and Nessy.
Barriers to learning these priorities address	I) Only a small proportion of pupils engaged with the provided learning. Therefore, children have returned to school below ARE.
	2) Some children have not had quality vocabulary exposure during lockdown and /or self-regulation and motor skills development.
